LHPUSD developed a plan compliant with all state and local health guidance and requirements. The Reopening Plan, now titled the Safe Return to In-Person Learning (SRTIPL), was initially approved by both the La Honda-Pescadero Unified School District Board of Trustees (LHPUSD), the San Mateo County Office of Education (SMCOE) and San Mateo County Department of Public Health (SMCDPH) on October 25, 2020. As public health guidance was amended, a revised SRTIPL was approved by the Board of Trustees in February 2021, March 2021 and April 2021. A full revision of the plan was approved by the LHPUSD Board, SMCOE and the SMCDPH on March 29, 2021.

The LHPUSD SRTIPL plan includes all requirements of the IFR with the exception of a description of the efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities. This was not a previous requirement of state and county guidance so was not included in any of the previously approved plans. LHPUSD staff has revised the SRTIPL plan to include a description of the districts effort to support community vaccination efforts and will post it within 30 days of receiving funds.

2. The district has partnered with a community based organization, Puente de la Costa Sur, and San Mateo County Department of Public Health to provide notice, support the setting of appointments and provides facility space for vaccination clinics on school properties.

LHPUSD ensures continuity of services in the case of future isolation, quarantine or school closures are required through the following services:

- Remote Learning Centers to support in-person learning which support student needs related to academic support, internet connectivity, English Learner services, and students with disabilities
- Home visits to support academic and social-emotional needs
- Food delivery and pick up options
- Student and staff COVID testing protocols
- Partnership with Puente to identify and provide mental health services to students and staff in need of services.

LHPUSD sought public input in the following ways:

- 1) Reopening Committee provided local input to the reopening plan during twice weekly meetings held June-August 2020
- 2) Superintendent Office Hours were held weekly from June 2020- February 2021 before tapering to less often meetings in March-May 2021. Input from stakeholders incorporated into the revisions of the plan include the pace of reopening to in-person learning, staff and student testing cadence and master schedule planning.
